CALL FOR COURSE PROPOSALS



The Perpetual Peace Project (PPP) begins from the understanding that the concept of "peace" is a poorly defined and has many meanings in different contexts (historical, political or diplomatic, religious or philosophical).

Beginning with this (mis)understanding, the Perpetual Peace Academy (PPA), in designing a virtual curriculum for perpetual peace, is now calling for new course proposals from international faculty across the disciplines, including artists, activists, designers and NGO's who will actively engage the concept of perpetual peace from their own disciplinary knowledge or creative practice.

Employing the same organizing principle of the Perpetual Peace Project, we will use the preliminary articles from Kant's treatise as design problems for courses and seminars. Proposals will be reviewed by the academy's curriculum committee and accepted course will be included in the curriculum for designing perpetual peace. They will be the basis for planning future events and conferences. Moreover, since the PPA is a unique university space not bound by location, nationality (or nationalism), academic culture or disciplinary prejudice (i.e., the two cultures model of the sciences and humanities), over the next several years we will choose courses to create pop-up programs of 2-3-day seminars and workshops in selected locations (e.g., Prague, Seoul, New York, Milan, etc.).



HOW TO PARTICIPATE



If you wish to participate in the PPA and submit a course proposal to be included in the curriculum, please adhere to the following guidelines and instructions:

1. Employ one of the preliminary articles to design a two-day seminar (each session approximately 3 hours) from your own disciplinary knowledge, creative practice, or technical expertise.
2. For initial consideration, we only need a title, a brief course description, and a list of readings or practical activities that can be accomplished in a two-day (six-hour) format.

If selected for a future pop-up event, a member of the PPA curriculum committee will contact you in further planning and arrangements for the seminar in the selected location, including travel and lodging arrangements.
